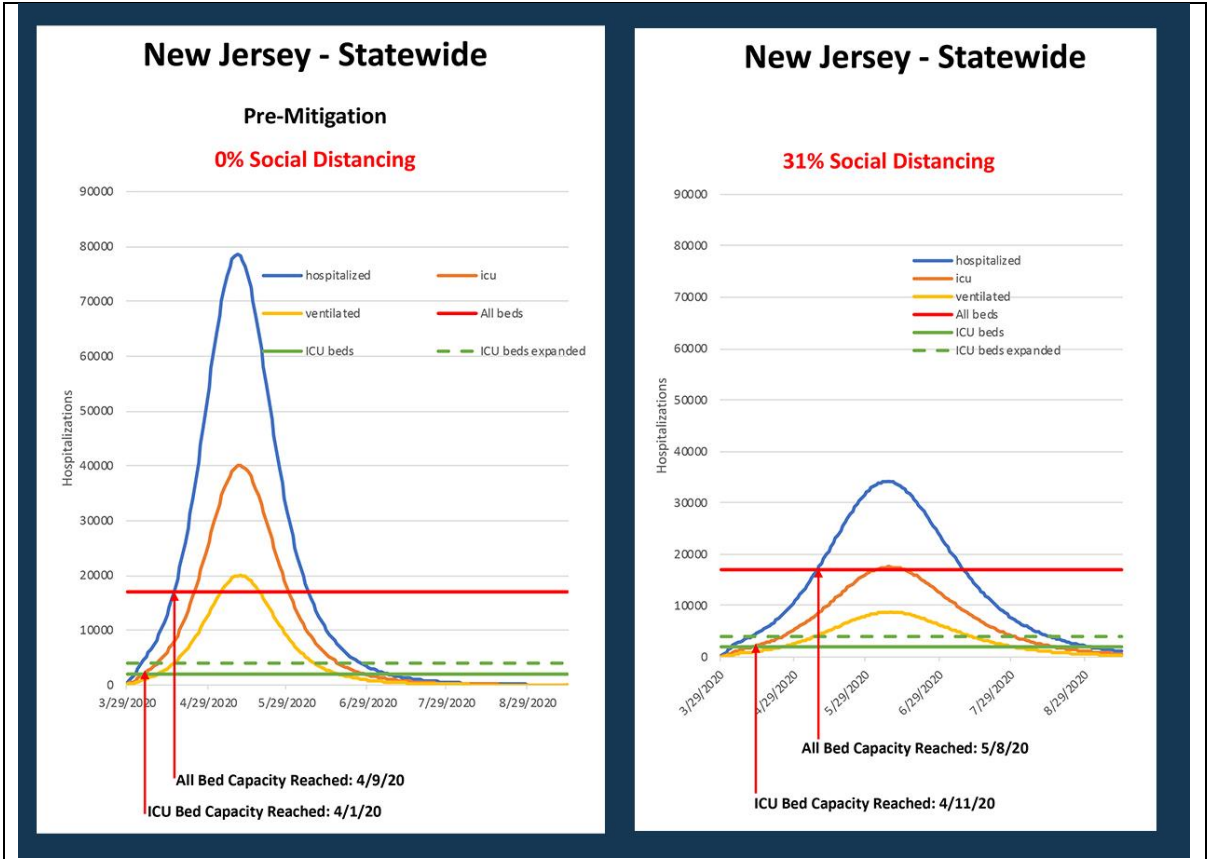
Update 14: March 30, 2020

Good afternoon,

Over the weekend, the CDC issued a [Domestic Travel Advisory for New York, New Jersey, and Connecticut](#), which caused some confusion. [Governor Murphy later offered a statement](#) clarifying the impact of the advisory on New Jersey: “To be clear, this non-binding advisory guidance does not change the rules that have been established and in place for over a week now under [Executive Order 107](#). If you have been working as part of our frontline response effort, from health care workers to supermarket workers, we still need you on the job.”

On Sunday, the [White House extended social-distancing guidelines until the end of April](#), President Trump said the peak of the death rate would hit in two weeks and predicts the country would be on its way to recovery by June 1.

Today, the governor spent a lot of time explaining why social distancing is important, and why all New Jerseyans should continue to obey the order. They shared the [following charts](#) comparing no mitigation, and impact of at least 31% compliance of social distancing.



Governor Murphy also announced that [U.S. Attorney Carpenito, AG Grewal, Acting Comptroller Walsh](#), have formed a [Federal-State COVID-19 Fraud Task Force](#)

The New Jersey COVID-19 Fraud Task Force will marshal the collective investigative power of federal and state law enforcement agencies by forming joint investigative and prosecution teams to quickly address fraud complaints. In addition, the Task Force will share information publicly about common frauds so individuals and businesses can better protect themselves. **Residents are encouraged to report possible misconduct through a hotline established by the National Center for Disaster Fraud at (866) 720-5721 or disaster@leo.gov.** Complainants may remain anonymous.

The Task Force warned New Jerseyans about the most common types of COVID-related frauds and misconduct, including: Unlawful hoarding; Price-gouging; Treatment scams; Supply scams; Provider scams; Charity scams; Phishing scams; App scams; and Investment scams.

New Jerseyans are reminded to not pump their own gas. Governor Murphy confirmed that New Jersey has “no plans to turn our gas stations into self-serve at this time.”

Governor Murphy also expressed his gratefulness to the private sector companies that complied with PPE inventory order required by [Executive Order 109](#) Section 7.

“STAY AT HOME” EXECUTIVE ORDER 107 STILL IN PLACE

As mentioned at the start, the “Stay at Home” **Executive Order No. 107** remains in full effect. “**Manufacturing, industrial, logistics, ports, heavy construction, shipping, food production, food delivery, and other commercial operations may continue to operate....**”

Governor continues to remind the private sector that even though the E.O. deems manufacturing and other businesses essential, social distancing and CDC guidelines must be followed at those locations.

Employees reporting to work are permitted to travel to and from their place of business. **Businesses are encouraged to give each employee a letter indicating that the employee works in an industry permitted to continue operations.** Essential employees should have the company letter, and company ID accessible while driving to and from work, so they can present it with their license if necessary. PRIVATE SECTOR ESSENTIAL EMPLOYEE REGISTRATION PROJECT

OEM has established a temporary process to help get critical infrastructure sites approved faster and provide essential employees with a temporary essential employee verification document that will expire in August 2020. Companies that get the temporary approval will then be required to take a training course in September to be able to maintain essential status and provide permanent cards to essential employees.

To date all the company requests received by CCNJ and submitted to OEM should have been contacted. Some companies were able to get into the permanent program, but most are in the temporary program, with opportunity to get permanent status in September when training is offered again.

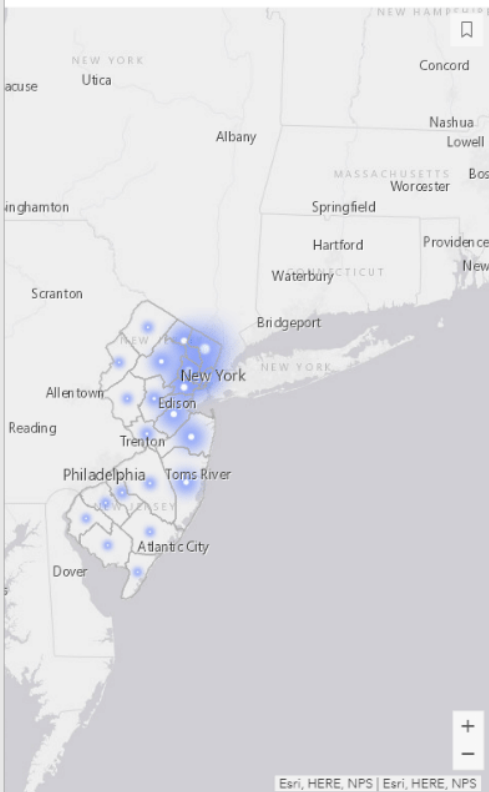
